— This handbook describes different play sequences, which encourage the integration of social, emotional and cognitive development in autistic children. Focuses on the four key skills of visualizing, imitation, mirroring, and turn-taking.



### **Daily Life Therapy: A Method of educating Autistic Children (1983).**

— This book is a record of the Daily Life Therapy educational method used at the Musashino Higashi Gakuen School in Japan. The Daily Life Therapy model “provides children with systematic education through group dynamics, modeling, and physical activity.”



### **Behavioral Intervention for Young Children with Autism: A Manual for Parents and Professionals (1996).**

— “Chapters on choosing an effective treatment, how to evaluate claims about treatments for autism, and what the research says about early behavioral intervention and other treatments.”

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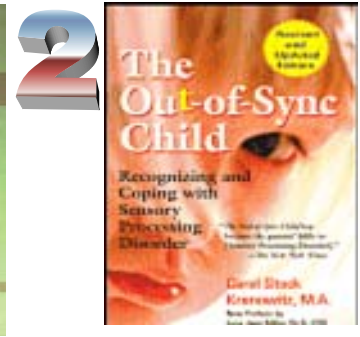
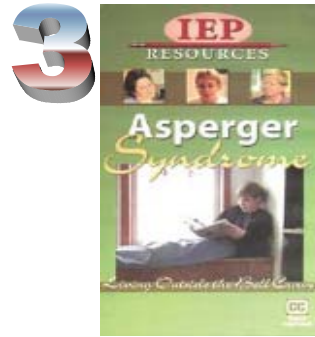

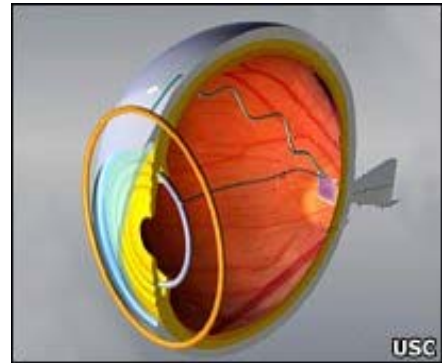


## [Hearing Loss Gene Discovered](#)
