


Intellectual Disability: Definition, Classification, and Systems of Supports (2010)

— "The 11th edition of the AAIDD definition manual continues our progress in both describing a person with an intellectual disability in several dimensions, not solely based on IQ or adaptive behavior, and integrating further the concept of supports into the definition and practice. Refinements based on an extensive feedback system, both in the field and in peer-reviewed literature, are incorporated making the 11th edition the most advanced of its kind."



From Sad to Glad: Kline on Depression (1974)



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

Teaching Social Skills to Youth with Mental Health Disorders (2009)

— " In this book, you'll find an introduction to the DSM-IV-TR and other mental health assessment and evaluation tools and how to individualize treatment plans while considering children's developmental, cultural, behavioral, emotional, social, genetic, and biological variables. The authors provide a series of charts that list the social skills that caregivers and treatment providers might target for each of more than a hundred diagnosis, common for children and adolescents"



How it feels to live with a Physical Disability (1992)

—" This book is a compilation of stories from 12 young people ranging in age from 6 to 16. Each youth has a different disability, as a result of birth or an accident. They speak with the author about their problems and coping skills with decidedly upbeat attitudes. They express how they cope with depression, public scrutiny, and medical treatment with confidence and maturity. Each chapter tells the story of one of these special children."



Anna's Silent World (1977)
