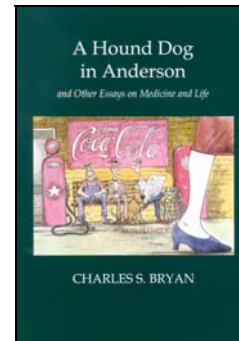
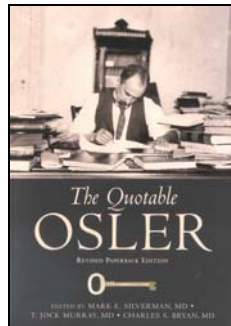
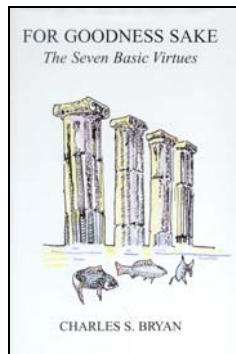

Charles S. Bryan is Heyward Gibbes Distinguished Professor of Internal Medicine at the University of South Carolina. He received his medical degree from The Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine and did postgraduate training at The Johns Hopkins Hospital and Vanderbilt University Medical Center. In 1977, after three years in private practice, he joined the charter faculty at the University of South Carolina School of Medicine where he has served as Director of the Division of Infectious Diseases (1977-1993), Chair of the Department of Medicine (1992-2000), and founder of the Midlands Care Consortium for patients with HIV/AIDS. He currently serves as Director of the Center for Bioethics and Medical Humanities at the University of South Carolina and as secretary-treasurer of the American Osler Society, an organization devoted to promoting the humanities and humanism in medical practice. Dr. Bryan is a Master of the American College of Physicians, a Fellow of the Royal College of Physicians of Edinburgh, and the author of more than 125 articles in the peer-reviewed journals, more than 300 editorials, and eight books and monographs.
