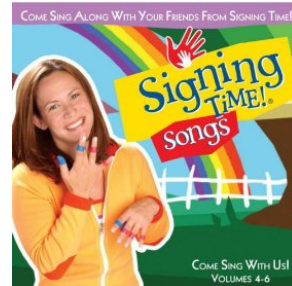

Baby Signing Time! (2008)

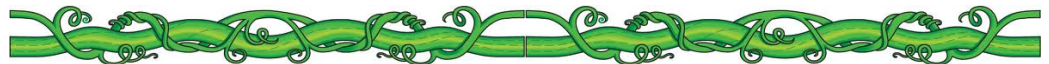
